## MOIR COTTAGE

Moir Cottage is available for holiday lets all year round. Recently fully refurbished, the cottage has three spacious bedrooms (two twin and one double – although the beds in the top twin bedroom can be pushed together to make a double), sitting room, dining room, kitchen and bathroom. There is a small courtyard garden to the rear.

The facilities include a washing machine, tumble drier, dishwasher, microwave, colour television with integrated DVD player. There is a free unlimited Broadband WiFi service available for guests.

*Bed linen and towels are provided.*

Moir Cottage is situated on the waterfront in the village with views across the harbour to the coast of Ireland. There is a small beach suitable for children within the harbour.

## PORTPATRICK VILLAGE

Portpatrick is a charming unspoilt village on the West coast of the Rhinns of Galloway some 8 miles south-west of Stranraer. It is set around a beautiful harbour with views across the North Irish Sea. There are several attractive beaches within easy driving distance and stunning cliff walks. The Southern Upland Way has its western starting point in the village. Dunskey Golf Club in Portpatrick has both 9 and 18 hole courses. There is also a fine putting green on the harbourside. There is a bowling green and all-weather tennis courts in the village. The village is well served by a general store, a post office and several craft and gift shops. A key feature of village life is the sea-going Portpatrick lifeboat.

## SURROUNDING PLACES OF INTEREST

Local places of interest include Logan Gardens, Glenwhan Gardens, Castle Kennedy Gardens, Loch Trool, the Whithorn archaeological dig, and Culzean Castle. There are also numerous golf courses in the area, including the famous Turnberry.

## EATING OUT

There is a good range of pubs and restaurants in the village and nearby including Campbell's Restaurant on the waterfront, The Port Pantry, The Waterfront, The Crown, Fern Hill Hotel (fine views over the village), and Mount Stewart Hotel amongst others.

Knockinaam Lodge in Port of Spittal Bay is approx. 4 miles south of Portpatrick. Knockinaam has won many awards including Michelin and AA stars. It provides fine dining experiences, but also serves excellent (and reasonably-priced) morning and

afternoon teas and coffees and bar lunches. The location alone makes a visit very worthwhile.

## OUTSIDE PORTPATRICK

Killantringan Lighthouse, just up the coast, has a magnificent sweep of sandy beach at the foot of the cliffs. You get to it via a track off the A764. The turnoff is clearly marked.

Alternatively, a walk from Portpatrick village to Killantringan along the coastal path is a great way to spend a few hours. It is about a 5-mile round-trip. The old building that housed the first telegraph link between Scotland and Ireland and onto the USA is in Mora Bay, on this walking route.

The Galloway Forest Park has beautiful forest drives, otter pools, wild goats, woodland sculptures and breathtaking scenery.

Culzean Castle is about an hour's drive up the Ayrshire Coast past Troon golf course. Drive a couple of miles further north to Knowleside to see and experience the *Electric Brae*, a natural optical illusion on the road your car will run uphill!

There are many other places to visit in the area.
